Safer plants for cats and dogs

African violet

Alyssum

Bachelors buttons

Boston fern

Christmas cactus

Cocks comb

Snapdragon

Dwarf palm

Most day lilies

Marigolds

Easter cactus

Cucumber

Impatiens

Cornflower Pine or spruce mulch

Non-toxic weed control

Use boiling water to kill weeds in your sidewalk/driveway.

Cats digging up your flowerbeds?

Keep cats out of your flowers by placing a layer of chicken wire over the garden and lightly cover it with soil. Cats don't like to catch their claws on the wire as they dig. Cats will usually avoid wet soil, so keep flowerbeds well watered and your cat will search elsewhere to hide.
